20.Distance education/online education:

Redressal ,it is an institutional responsibility of time bound delivery and quality reliability of students services through the prizes or punishments .

The object of the system is to transform the programmes to be equitant to the highest quality in class programmes available at the institution The Highest students evaluations and peer reviews of course /programmes and teachers at the institutions will be nominated by a rigorous process and to be converted into OLD courses and programmes particularly MOOCs. High quality ODL courses and programmes will be expanded to i) to enhance learning accessibility ii) Lifelong learning promotion iii) support the continuous professional development etc. and finally to have both the traditional and open , distance learning modes to be institutionalized and rationalized as well as to ensure the quality of open and distance learning.
